History of January 1

- ♦ 1664: Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj started the Surat campaign.
- ♦ 1772: After the death of Peshwa Madhav Rao I his younger brother Narayan Rao assumed the throne.
- ♦ 1949 : Ceasefire was declared in Kashmir.
- 1915: Mahatma Gandhi was awarded the Saffrone-Hind by the Viceroy for his work in South Africa.
- ◆ 1992 : India and Pakistan exchanged lists of their nuclear installations for the first time.

Current Affairs Related to 1 January

- The Parliamentary Standing Committee has recommended that the Center should extend the deadline for the scheme for rapid adoption and manufacturing of electric vehicles by at least three years. Whereas the deadline of this scheme is 31 March 2024. Its budget outlay is Rs 10,000 crore. The main objective of the FAME-II scheme is to provide incentives on the purchase of electric and hybrid vehicles and to add economical charging stations.
- The Center has launched a massive survey and registration process to identify eligible beneficiaries of Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana Gramin among 75 especially vulnerable tribal groups in 18 states and union territories. The Ministry of Rural Development uses its dedicated online application Aawas+ App to identify beneficiaries of the Rural Housing Scheme. Under the Prime Minister's Tribal Justice Maha Abhiyan, there is a plan to construct a total of 4.9 lakh houses especially for the vulnerable tribal groups.
- Wheebox in collaboration with various agencies including All India Council for Technical Education, Confederation of Indian Industry and Association of Indian Universities has published the India Skills Report 2024, which highlights India's skills land-scape and the impact of Artificial Intelligence on the workforce.
- Researchers have discovered a new species of Cyperaceae in the lateritic hills of Kannur district. The name of this species is Fimbristylis geliliana. This species is named after the late plant taxonomist Abdul Jalil. This genus was one of the largest genera of the Cyperaceae family, represented by 320 species distributed in tropical and subtropical regions.
- ♦ The Supreme Court in Union of India and Others vs. Air Commodore N.K. The Sharma case made it clear that tribunals, working within the strict parameters of their governing laws, cannot direct the government to make policy.

- Vita Dani has created history as the first Indian appointed to the Governing Board of the International Table Tennis Federation Foundation, a significant achievement in her illustrious career. Commenting on his remarkable achievement, Vita Dani expressed his excitement and said, it is a great feeling to join such an organization. Which aligns perfectly with my vision for the growth of table tennis and its impact on the community.
- UNESCO Asia Pacific Prize 2023 awarded. Its objective is to encourage private sector participation and public-private collaboration in the preservation of the cultural heritage of the region for the benefit of present and future generations. According to UNESCO's Bangkok office, the jury evaluated a total of 48 projects from 8 countries and 12 projects were selected for the honour.
- Bengaluru-based fintech slice-backed North East Small Finance Bank has announced the appointment of Satish Kumar Kalra as its interim managing director and chief executive officer. This important step comes as part of the ongoing merger process between Slice and NESFB, marking a unique development in the fintech and banking sector.
- Former Governor of the Reserve Bank of India, Raghuram Rajan, along with economist Rohit Lamba, has released a ground-breaking book titled Breaking the Mould: Reimagining India's Economic Future. This latest addition to Rajan's literary output marks a significant exploration into the possibilities and challenges of India's economic trajectory.
- ♦ Under IRDAI Vision 2047, the government aims to provide insurance for all by 2047, which means that every citizen has adequate life, health and property insurance coverage and every enterprise is supported by appropriate insurance solutions.
