### History of January 27

- ◆ **1974** : President V.V. Giri dedicated the Nehru Memorial Museum at Teen Murti, New Delhi to the nation.
- ◆ **1967** : Three astronauts died in the Apollo 1 accident.
- ◆ **1988** : Helicopter mail service was inaugurated for the first time.
- ◆ **1948** : The first tape recorder was sold
- ◆ **1556** : Emperor Humayun of the Mughal Empire died.
- ◆ **2008** : Bird flu spread in 13 districts of West Bengal.

### Current Affairs Related to 27 January

- ◆ India is set to launch a year-long festival to explore global connections through the celebration of Ramayana and its cultural significance. Along with the Ram temple in Ayodhya, it marks the beginning of a cultural festival uniting the world through Ramayana. The festival started from the historic Purana Qila in Delhi and passed through various cities like Lucknow, Ayodhya and Varanasi. Cultural activities will be started with the cooperation of state governments at iconic places related to Ramayana including Chitrakoot in Madhya Pradesh, Ayodhya in Uttar Pradesh, Sitamarhi in Bihar, Hampi in Karnataka and Kanyakumari in Tamil Nadu.
- ◆ In an important step for the industry especially in green energy the government has introduced regulations to accelerate energy storage installation and enhance energy security. Specifically, specialized consumers can now operate dedicated transmission lines without a license, a privilege previously reserved for generating companies and captive stations. This change promotes access to the green energy sector and accelerates business processes.
- ◆ Vice Admiral A N Pramod takes charge as Director General of Naval Operations. AN Pramod, an alumnus of the 38th Integrated Cadet Course, Naval Academy Goa, was commissioned into the Indian Navy on 1 July 1990. This Flag Officer is actually a CAT AC King Air Operations Officer and communications and electronics warfare expert. He underwent Staff Course at DSSC Wellington and Naval Higher Command Course at NWC, Goa.
- ◆ US Air Force pilot Madison Marsh has created history by winning the title of Miss America 2024. Madison Marsh is the first active duty Air Force officer to win this title. 22-year-old Madison Marsh was crowned Miss America 2024. Madison, a second lieutenant in the U.S. Air Force and a master's student in the public policy program at Harvard Kennedy School, won a beauty pageant in Orlando, Florida.
- ◆ Military history will be preserved under the Shaurya Anthila project. These initiatives have been launched as part of the Army's endeavor to preserve the glorious past of the Army for the future generation. More than 1300 units, formations, regimental centers and military museums hold 700 hours of audio visual material and 11 lakh pages of records in the form of war memoirs. Another kiosk will be set up in the upcoming history cell of the Army War College.
- ◆ Prime Minister Narendra Modi inaugurated the new campus of the National Customs Indirect Taxes and Narcotics Academy at Palasamudram in Sri Sathya Sai district of Andhra Pradesh.
- ◆ President of India Smt. Draupadi Murmu inaugurated the 5th edition of Meghalaya Games in Tura, Meghalaya. In his address, the President highlighted the tremendous potential for development of sports and sportspersons in the North East region, citing the rich tradition of strong sports culture.
- ◆ After 40 years of distinguished service, INS Cheetah, Guldar and Kumbhir were decommissioned. The decommissioning ceremony of these ships was conducted in a traditional ceremony at Port Blair, in which the National Flag, Naval Ensign and the decommissioning emblem of the three ships were lowered for the last time at sunset. INS Cheetah, Guldar and Kumbhir were built at the Polnocny Srinivasa shipyard in Gdynia, Poland, as ships that could deliver tanks, vehicles, cargo and troops directly to a low-lying beach without having to dock.
- ◆ India's first National Highway Steel Slag Road section on NH-66 Mumbai Goa National Highway was inaugurated by Dr. VK Saraswat, Member NITI Aayog. Steel slag road technology developed by Council of Scientific and Industrial Research Central Road Research Institute is converting waste from steel industries into wealth. It is assisting the National Highway Authority of India in building sustainable and environment friendly highways in the country.

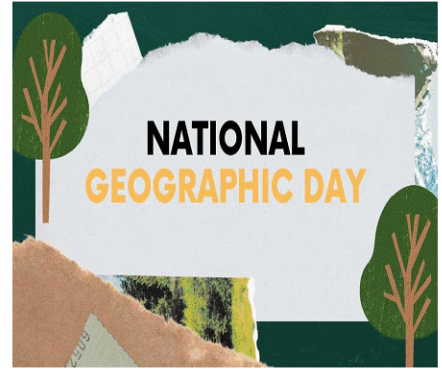
